

## NOTICE ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER

### Failure to Correct a Significant Deficiency

Public Water System Name: Emerald Lake Village District PWS ID: 1141020

We are required to correct significant water system deficiencies identified by Department of Environmental Services (NHDES). We failed to take the required action by the established date.

**This is not an emergency.** If it had been, you would have been notified immediately. We do not know of any case of contamination. However, until the problem is corrected, there is an increased chance that disease causing organisms could contaminate the water supply and potentially cause an illness.

*Inadequately treated or inadequately protected water may contain disease-causing organisms. These organisms include bacteria, viruses and parasites which can cause symptoms such as; nausea, cramps, diarrhea and associated headaches. These symptoms, however, are not caused only by organisms in drinking water, but also by other factors. If you experience any of these symptoms and they persist, you may want to seek medical advice.*

**What should I do?** There is nothing you need to do at this time. You do not need to boil your water or take other corrective actions.

The table below lists the outstanding significant deficiency(ies), when correction of the deficiency(ies) was due and the corrective action we have (or will be) taking.

Steps being taken to correct the situation: Continue to apply for state leak detection yearly, just completed 2024-2025.

Check zone meters daily for any spikes in usage. Working on Pilot Testing to get our new well at Eastman put online.

Another 9-10 roads water mains replaced in 2024. Expected Resolution Date: December 31, 2026
